	Survey Findings	Issues Raised	Possible Actions?
<h2>Housing</h2> 	82% of respondents were satisfied with their current accommodation	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• need more energy efficient housing• need more facilities so that residents can stay independent in later life	Sharing gardens
<h2>Streets and Outdoor Spaces</h2> 	65% of respondents were satisfied with their local streets and outdoor spaces	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• tidier and cleaner spaces• safer spaces with better lighting• hazards (such as potholes and obstructions) removed	Walking audits by network members
<h2>Health</h2> 	47% of respondents were able to access adequate health services	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• difficulty accessing GPs• lack of transport to access health services	Social Prescribers and links to wider support services
<h2>Communication</h2> 	59% of respondents find information easy and accessible to find	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• concerns about reliance on digital communication	Two pronged approach, i.e. organisations offering more than digital communication approaches

Transport



50% of respondents found it easy to get out and about

- lack of reliable public transport at appropriate times and frequencies

More over 50+ input into public transport

Social Activity



65% of respondents felt able to access local social and community activities

- improve promotion of activities
- make activities diverse, accessible and inclusive

The Network will promote activities through local organisations

Contributing to the Community



75% of respondents feel that they contribute to their community

- improve recruitment for paid work/volunteering
- introduce more flexible working

Advocate and work with local employers

Being included in the Community



49% of respondents feel valued as a member of their local community

- tackle age/homophobic discrimination and disregard

- people aged 50+ to train social workers, health professionals etc on their needs
- combined age groups sharing accommodation/facilities

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
