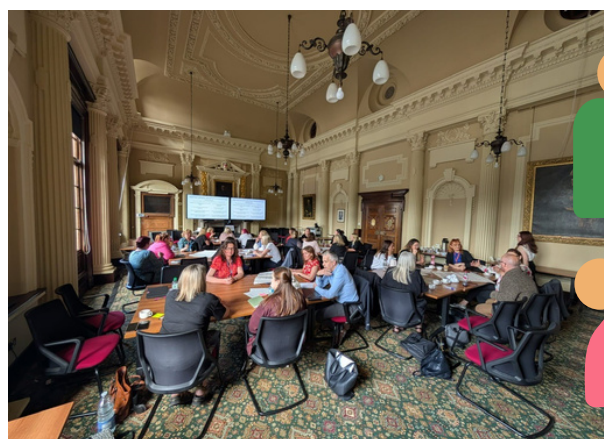
One Cohesive Workforce
